Radiant Heart Award Presented to Robert and Mary Ann Kaminski

The Radiant Heart Award is an annual honor bestowed upon an exceptional supporter, recognizing their extraordinary dedication to the mission of Light of Hearts Villa. Introduced last year, the award celebrates those who have gone above and beyond, giving not only of their time and treasures but also sharing their remarkable talents, all without expecting anything in return.

The 2023 Radiant Heart Award was presented to Deacon Robert and Mrs. Mary Ann Kaminski. Their children, Janice Marie and Bob Kaminski, accepted the award on their behalf at the Light Way Gala.

“Bob and Mary Ann Kaminski have shown an unparalleled commitment to our community, demonstrating

their boundless care and concern for the well-being of our residents. Their generosity and devotion to Light of Hearts Villa have profoundly impacted our community,” said Amy Huntley, Light of Hearts Villa director of development and communications.

Their support during last year’s #weGIVECATHOLIC day of giving helped raise more than \$30,000 for the Benevolent Fund after their matching \$15,000 grant. Raising a total of \$30,821 during the day of giving secured third place in the nonprofit category among more than 60 nonprofits. It was nothing short of incredible.

#weGIVECATHOLIC was November 29. Unfortunately, Bob passed away at the age of 86 a few weeks later on Christmas day. His legacy, however, lives on in the love and kindness he and Mary Ann have shared with the Light of Hearts Villa community.

The Heart of Their Giving Spirit

The question that often arises when we witness such selfless generosity is, “What drives individuals like Bob and Mary Ann Kaminski to have such a heart for philanthropy?” Their daughter, Janice, offers insight into their giving spirit:

“I believe my parents’ spirit of giving is best understood by quoting from a speech my father once gave. He quoted St. Paul in his First Letter to Corinthians: ‘What do you possess that you have not received? But if you have received it, why are you boasting as if you did not receive it?’ (1 Corinthians 4:7). He added: ‘Yes, everything is a gift. Our very lives are a gift. Mary Ann and I recognize that everything we are and

everything we have is a gift. As Catholic Christians, we are charged with humble acceptance, growing our gifts and giving back as good stewards.”

Bob and Mary Ann Kaminski embodied the essence of this philosophy, recognizing that life and everything it entails are blessings to be shared with others.



90 Years Young and Celebrating a Lifetime of Memories

Residents at Light of Hearts Villa have a wealth of life experiences, wisdom and stories to share. Celebrating them acknowledges and appreciates the value they bring to our community. It recognizes their individuality and unique contributions. In this edition of Villa Voices, we celebrate resident Althea Johnson and her recent 90th birthday.

Althea Johnson's life story is a remarkable journey of love, family and unwavering strength. Born on August 31, 1933, in Greensboro, North Carolina, to parents John and Hortense Collette, she has always been an older sister and a source of joy for her sister Glendia.

Althea's early years were shaped by the loving care of her mother, grandmother "MaMa" and Aunt Margaret. Her father had moved north for employment, and eventually, her parents went their separate ways. Althea's education began at St. Frances de Sales boarding school in Powhatan County, Virginia, where she was exposed to the values of empowerment and education for Native and African American communities in the United States.

Her mother remarried, and they became a family as they embarked on the "Great Migration" to Cleveland after junior high school. Althea attended Glenville High School. It was then that she met her high school sweetheart, Ervin Thompson, and met her dear friend Bobbi Harrison. Althea's compassionate spirit led her to volunteer as a candy striper at a local hospital. After high school, she went to Hampton University in Virginia, studying physical therapy for two years. She left college to marry Ervin when he finished his service in the United States Air Force.

They married in 1953 and raised three children in Cleveland – Micheale-Lynn, William and Gary. She

spent much of that time as a homemaker, but found time to work at General Electric for a couple years as her children grew. Ervin was a science teacher and retired as an elementary school principal. He passed away in 1986.

Althea continued to be a pillar of strength for her family and community. In time, she found love once more and married Kenneth Johnson. They shared several beautiful years together before his passing in 1995. As a grandmother, she worked at the Early Childhood Education Center (ECEC), a preschool in Shaker Heights.

Althea's dedication to her family has always been paramount, and she often says, "My family is my heart." She cared for her aging mother until her passing in 2010. In 2015, she moved in with her sister Glendia in Rockford, Illinois, where they enjoyed life together,



sharing activities, friends and trips to visit family. In November 2022, Althea returned to Cleveland to be closer to her children, living with her son William and his wife, Doris. In April 2023, Althea moved to Light of Hearts Villa and she soon found her way to Lumen Lane, where she rekindled her friendship with her high school friend Bobbi, who is also a resident.

Her daughter, Micheale-Lynn, said there are multiple reasons Althea and her family chose Light of Hearts Villa, with one them being the Lumen Lane Memory Care neighborhood. “It is a safe and secure area with plenty of space for independent movement that is calm and exceptionally clean. Mom once spontaneously said,

‘I love this place. The people are kind, they tend to you and see where you are and what you need.’ When I said ‘nothing too good for you right?’ mom said, ‘Yeah, nothin too good for Althea.’ This gave both of us a good chuckle.”

Althea’s vibrant spirit continues to shine and she remains active, participating in various activities. When she’s not engaged in the community’s events, she finds joy in spending quality time with her beloved family. Her warm smile and enduring love are a testament to a life well lived and cherished.

Happy 90th birthday, Althea! We are blessed to have you with us at Light of Hearts Villa. ♦

Tips for Year-End Planning to Benefit Both You and Light of Hearts Villa

Thanks to you, our generous donors, Light of Hearts Villa is able to provide exceptional, compassionate care to those who need it most in a beautiful, comfortable home. Following are some points to consider as you plan your end-of-year giving.

IRA Charitable Rollover Gift

If you are 70½ years of age or older, you can support Light of Hearts Villa through distributions from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Your IRA Charitable Rollover Gift may satisfy your annual required minimum distribution and reduce your taxable income.

Gifts of Stock

You may also consider donating gifts of stock. Depending on the stock’s current value, you may avoid capital gains tax or deduct the loss in value while donating the proceeds of the sale to Light of Hearts Villa. Consult your financial advisor for the most advantageous opportunities for you.

Bequests

Creating a bequest is one of the most popular options for legacy giving. With the help of a lawyer, you can designate which charities or nonprofits are included in your will. This can be done a number of ways:

- **Percent bequest** — where a certain percent of your estate will can be donated
- **Specific bequest** — where a certain dollar amount is gifted
- **Residual bequest** — where a gift is made from the balance of your estate

Bequests are ideal for donors who want to split their estate between family, friends and their favorite charitable nonprofits. You can also designate that your bequest be spread out across several years, so the money isn’t spent all at once.

Charitable Gift Annuity

Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA) continue to be a popular gift for many. A Light of Hearts Villa Charitable Gift Annuity is a simple agreement between you and Light of Hearts Villa (LOHV). In exchange for your gift, LOHV promises to pay you a fixed sum each year for life. After your lifetime, the remainder will go toward LOHV’s mission of care and compassion.

A Light of Hearts Villa CGA allows you to make a gift that will pay you income for life at very attractive fixed rates of return. Current bank certificate of deposit rates are paying up to 5%, but if you are 75 years old, you can establish a Light of Hearts Villa CGA with an income rate of 6%. The minimum age to establish an LOHV annuity is 60.
