Back in the fall of 1989, Margie Aumiller was asked to spend a day volunteering her time to answer the phone at the recently opened Light of Hearts Villa. That day was October 12, 1989. Her one day turned into 27 years of serving as a volunteer receptionist once a week.

"Those few hours went well and were enjoyable, and I was given the job," quipped Margie.

When her husband Gil became a retired accountant in 1990, Sr. Helen Scasny, SC, founding director of Light of Hearts Villa, discovered the news and quickly had Gil volunteering his time as well. He has helped out

once a week for the past 27 years with accounting tasks like budgeting, reconciling accounts and more, plus helping decorate at Christmas time and with various other tasks as needed.

"I like the interaction with residents," said Gil. "Assisting people in their aging process is a privilege and the folks who work there are just wonderful at it."

Margie stepped away from her receptionist duties last fall, but remains an active volunteer. She now works once a week in the Cozy Corner gift store and helps sort donations of clothes and other items.

And the love goes both ways. While serving as receptionist, Margie often sent birthday cards to residents. One resident moved to a skilled nursing facility, so she lost touch with her. When Margie learned the former resident passed away, she and Gil drove out to the west side of Cleveland for the wake.

"I walked into the funeral home and her daughter came running up to me, letting me know that her mother saved every card and note I had sent her. It's easy to become so attached to residents because if you're kind to them, they'll forever remember you. It's been a joy to volunteer at Light of Hearts Villa for so long," said Margie.

Margie and Gil are also active members and volunteers at their church, Our Lady of Hope Roman Catholic Parish in Bedford, where they collect food to deliver to the Seton Safety Net food pantry at the Villa. They also collect clothes from both their parish and the Villa to deliver to Joseph's Home in Cleveland, which is another ministry of the Sisters of Charity Health System. Joseph's Home helps acutely ill homeless men heal and achieve independence.

Gil succinctly summed up the couple's approach to volunteering. "We go where the need is."

Thankfully for Light of Hearts Villa and the many residents they've touched, Gil and Margie have been going where the need is for 28 years. ◆

Judy McIntyre is a very detail-oriented person, which is good news for the residents of the Villa. Judy has been ensuring residents have clean clothes for the past eight years as part of the housekeeping and laundry staff. For every resident who has her do their laundry, she knows just how each one wants their clothes washed and folded, and she knows exactly what items belong to which resident.

But, her job goes far beyond clothes and bedding. She is in and out of residents' rooms throughout the day, so she gets to know each resident on a personal basis. She said she views her job as making residents' lives as easy as possible, whether it involves laundry or something else. She might help a resident put on a sock or a shoe if they need assistance or engage them in conversation if they want to talk.

Maybe that's why it didn't come as a surprise to others at the Villa when Judy received the Making God's Love Visible Award earlier this year. The award is the highest honor given to a member of the staff and is based on nominations from fellow employees.

"Judy is very conscientious in making sure that residents are happy and making sure their cleanliness is a top priority," said Dennis Giangiacomo, director of facility operations and Judy's supervisor.

Receiving the award did come as a surprise to Judy, who was caught off guard when she learned about the honor. "I was shocked and in disbelief," she said. She said there are many on staff who work hard and have been at the Villa a long time. "This is a busy place, so I didn't realize people would think of me and notice how hard I work for our residents. I was very honored to receive the award."

Judy was presented with an award plaque at the annual Missioning In Service event in January, which is held to recognize the Villa's dedicated staff and volunteers. The event includes the "anointing of hands," an ancient rite recognizing those with special roles in the community. Jean and Dan Konfal Honor Uncle's Will Request with Gift to the Villa

Stanley Caplinsky worked hard his entire life, serving in World War II and then as an inspector for the Illuminating Company for more than 35 years.

In 2014 at the age of 91, with hearing and vision challenges growing, Stan decided he was no longer comfortable living in an apartment by himself. Since his wife had passed away several years before, he wanted the support an assisted living facility could offer, so he asked his niece, Jean Konfal, and her husband Dan, to help him find a new home. Jean and Dan took Stan to visit a half-dozen area facilities, but nothing seemed to please him until they brought him to Light of Hearts Villa.

"We all loved it. It was absolutely different than any other place. After visiting, my uncle kept calling me to ask, 'Did you get me on the list?' We did and, luckily not long after, we were able to get him into Light of Hearts Villa," said Jean. "The day he moved in all the staff already knew him by name, putting him at ease right away. We knew we didn't have to worry about him because he was in good hands."

Not long after Stan moved in, Jean and Dan had a discussion with him about his finances and his estate.

Stan wanted to donate much of his estate to charity and was considering several larger national charities. However, he ultimately decided on charities closer to home that had directly touched his life, and none had touched him more than Light of Hearts Villa.

"Stan was thrilled to be able to offer something back," said Jean. With his blessing, the final bequest decisions were made. She said Light of Hearts Villa was an easy choice because her uncle recognized that he wasn't giving to just an institution—he was giving to real people.

"Stan realized others at Light of Hearts Villa were of his generation, so he was giving to people he knew and people that would come after him. Like him, they could continue to receive the exceptional care he received," said Jean.

Unfortunately, Stan passed away in October 2016, but his legacy lives on in helping support the mission of Light of Hearts Villa in using faith-based values to affirm the integrity of each person and encourage them on their journey of aging by providing compassionate care in a loving environment. •
