Lumen Lane Memory Care Neighborhood Thriving a Year after Expansion



It has been one year since the newly renovated and expanded Lumen Lane Neighborhood officially opened. With additional space, the residents now have designated rooms for activities and dining, eliminating the kind of confusion that can come from not knowing whether they are doing an activity or eating a meal. The space itself is well-lit and calming with neutral blue tones and high-grade flooring. The sensory room is actively used with different sensory activities in every corner, including a 100-gallon saltwater fish tank.

“When we chose the design of the new area, we were very purposeful with every design decision. Down to the kind of

chairs and color of plates they would eat off of. Each part was thoughtfully discussed and researched on best practices for memory care individuals and I was so happy with how everything turned out,” said Breanne Cavileer, executive director. “The plan was always to bring that same look and feel of the calming blue walls and wood panel flooring throughout the rest of the building gradually.”

One year later and Breanne and her team have already completed the renovation of the first floor Lumen Lane hallway and have begun updating the first floor of the assisted living side.

“There is a night-and-day difference of the Lumen Lane hallway. It feels more bright and cheery. I had a resident tell me that the artwork brought her joy and I can see every day residents stop to utilize one of the life stations and feel that sense of familiarity and productivity. I’m really proud of the space we created for them and so excited to see the updates brought to the rest of the building as well,” said Anne Messer, director of life enrichment.

Breanne said it has been an exciting journey to raise the funds and support needed for the project. She added, “Our residents and staff are loving it.”

presentation of special awards and more. There will also be a rare bourbon raffle featuring hard-to-find bourbons from around the world.

WHY THIS FUNDRAISER IS SO IMPORTANT: MEDICAID SHORTFALL IN 2021: \$795,915

Benevolent care is defined as the forgiveness or discounting of monthly fees for a resident's apartment and services who have income that is not sufficient to cover the monthly fees, who have exhausted their assets/funds through no fault nor deliberate act to cause their inability to pay, and meet the approval criteria for benevolent care.

The Medicaid program is funded by state and federal governments. In many states, including Ohio, Medicaid payments are not sufficient to cover the costs of treating Medicaid beneficiaries, like some of our residents. In 2021, our Medicaid shortfall was \$795,915. Meaning, if all residents were private pay residents like most corporate for-profit care facilities, that is the amount of additional income we would see on our books.

Because of our faith-based mission, we prioritize providing this kind of benevolent care to those in need. The Sister Helen T. Scasny, SC Benevolent Fund is fully funded by grants, foundations and individual donations who help us make up this shortfall. It simply would not be possible without the help of our community.

Elena Bonomo Celebrates 102 Years at Monthly Birthday Bash

“Birthday Bash” celebrations are held each month. “We celebrate every resident whose birthday is in that month and for special milestone birthdays, we have the mayor come in and read a proclamation and present a certificate of congratulations. It really makes each resident feel special and celebrated,” said Anne Messer, director of life enrichment.

FEELING GOOD AT 102

In March, the Light of Hearts Villa community celebrated the birthday of Elena and her 102 years of history. Elena was born on March 22, 1920, in Ponza, Italy, and immigrated to the United States when she was a teenager. Growing up, she learned how to sew and worked as a high-end dressmaker in New York City’s Garment District. She had a 40-year career in the garment industry as a professional seamstress. She met her future husband Angelo Bonomo in New York and they were married on October 31, 1948 at Our Lady of the Pity Church. He owned a pizzeria where Elena also helped out.

She took an active role in her son Robert’s education and taught herself to read, write and speak English in the process. Robert eventually went to medical school and became a doctor. When Angelo’s health began to decline in retirement, the couple moved to Cleveland to be closer to their son. Angelo passed away in 2014 at the age of 100 and Elena moved to Light of Hearts Villa not long after.

When asked about living at Light of Hearts Villa, Elena said, “I love warm afternoons on the pretty patio and activities like coloring and puzzles. Everyone is very friendly and kind.”

There’s something in the water at Light of Hearts Villa. That’s the belief that Robert Bonomo expressed after his mother Elena turned 102 on March 22. Elena has been a resident since February 2015, when she was just about to turn 95. She stays involved by participating in activities and visiting with other residents.

Part of the core of Light of Hearts Villa is to truly see each individual person for who they are, respect their history and provide premier care. “Each one of our residents has a story to share, a whole life lived. It’s so important to recognize that and honor their lives as best we can,” said Breanne Cavileer, executive director.

Frequently Asked Questions

HOW DO YOU BECOME A LIGHT THE WAY LEGACY SOCIETY MEMBER?

By naming Light of Hearts Villa as a beneficiary in your estate plan or establishing a Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA) with Light of Hearts Villa:

Bequests — You make a gift from your estate to Light of Hearts Villa. Your estate may claim a tax deduction for the full amount of your charitable bequest.

Charitable Gift Annuities — A charitable gift annuity with Light of Hearts Villa is a gift that gives back. It can provide you and/or another beneficiary with stable income for life. You may also receive an immediate income tax deduction.

Charitable trusts — You designate in your will that a certain amount of money or property will be transferred to Light of Hearts Villa. Your estate receives a charitable deduction for the full, fair market value of your gift.

Life insurance — You make a gift of life insurance to Light of Hearts Villa. You may find you no longer need the financial protection of existing life insurance policies. By making Light of Hearts Villa a beneficiary of all or part of your policy would capitalize a new fund at the time of your death, and your estate would receive a charitable deduction based on the policy's current value.

Retirement assets — You name Light of Hearts Villa as the beneficiary of all or part of your retirement plan assets upon your death. Your estate avoids paying large income and estate tax bills.
