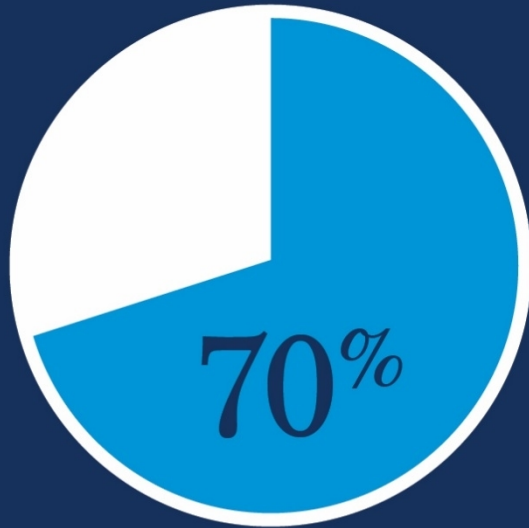

The Neighborhood Need

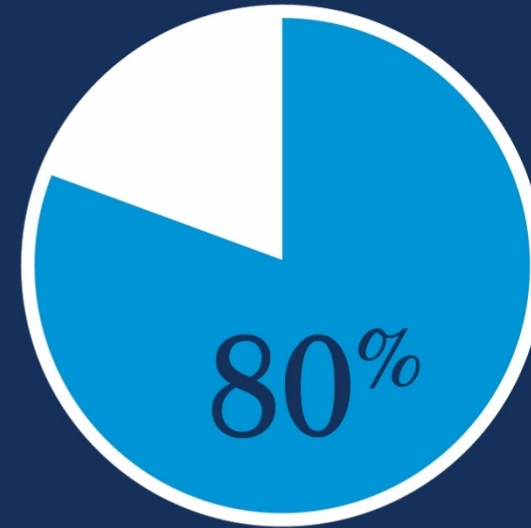
Cleveland's Central neighborhood and its nearly 12,000 residents face any number of inherent challenges—including generational trauma, poverty and violence. Addressing the most critical needs of residents and the surrounding area is a priority for the St. Vincent Charity Health & Healing Hub.



70% of neighborhood residents live below the poverty line.



\$10,000 median household income (family of five)
Below the national poverty level of \$37,000*



80% of its children live below the poverty line.

Most Recent Developments



PARTNERSHIPS IN PROGRESS

Partnerships are a key component to focus on the root causes of poverty and address identified needs.

- **CARE ALLIANCE** — high-quality, comprehensive medical and dental care, along with patient advocacy, referrals to addiction medicine and other health-related services.
- **ESPERANZA** — expertise in education, mentoring and wraparound support to help teens and their families navigate mental health challenges.
- **GOODWILL INDUSTRIES** — will build a Goodwill Opportunity Center on the Hub campus with a full-service neighborhood grocery store, plus employment and career services, and health and social services. Expected to open in 2028.



Other Components of the Hub

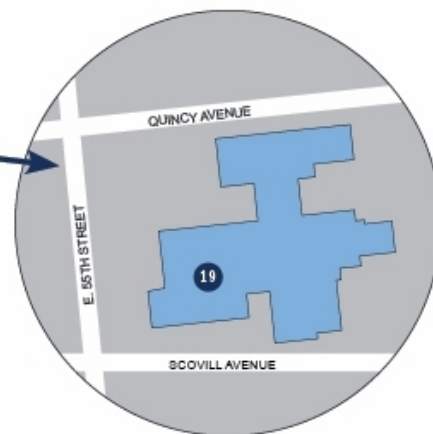
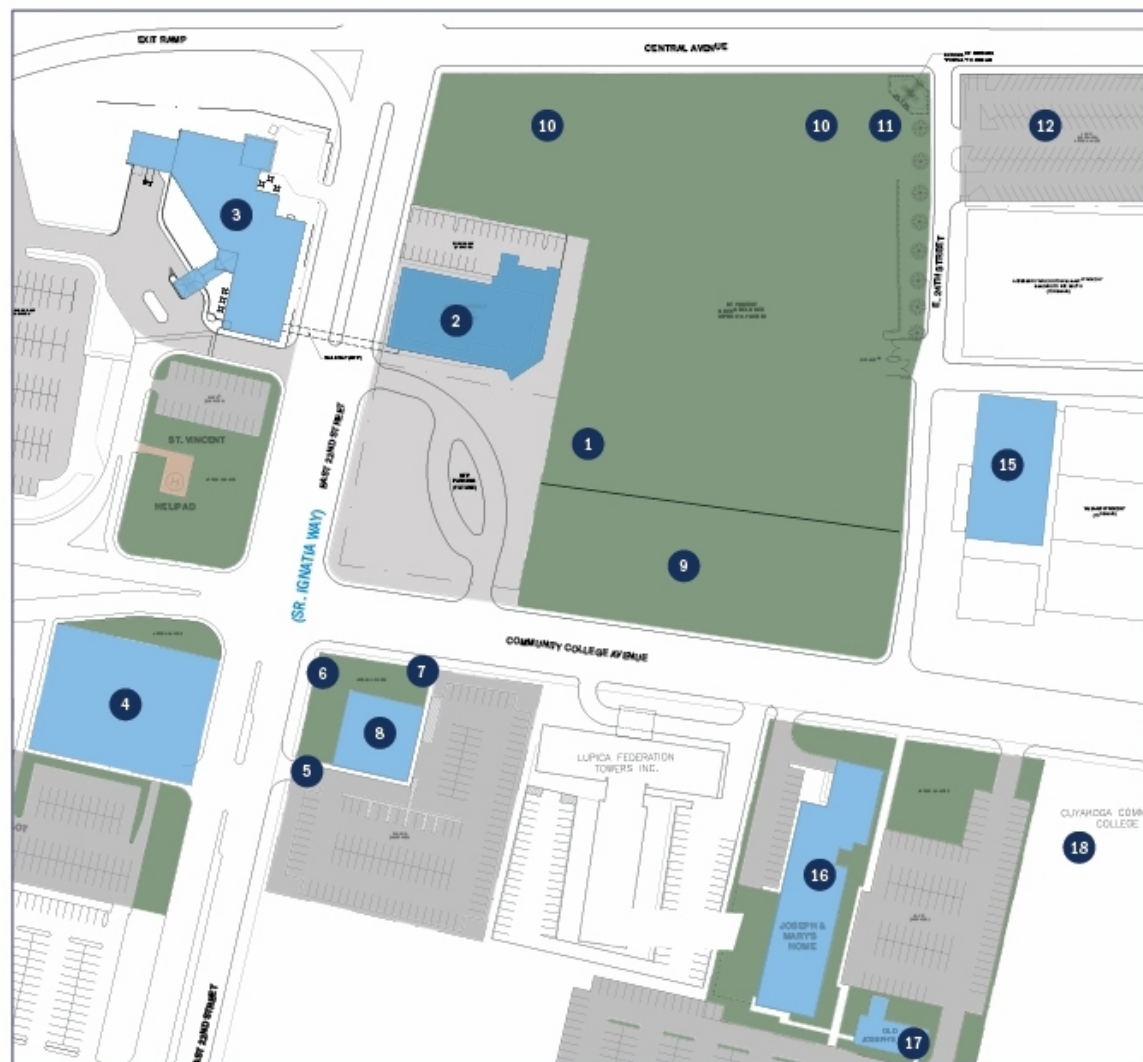


The Hub will also host several key collaborators who will help address social drivers of health, which include:

- *Nourishing Communities* — providing meals and operating community grocery stores
- *Addressing Homelessness and Building Housing Stability* — supportive & transitional housing, drop-in centers for at-risk youth, rehabilitate neighborhood homes
- *Expanding Access to Health Care* — primary care, dental care, pharmacy services addiction medicine treatment
- *Advancing Education & Academic Success* — summer and school-year academic support, after-school programming, tutoring and mentoring, support students at Marion-Sterling School
- *Strengthening Families with Support & Resources* — “parent university” workshops & training, family home visits, maternal care & support, fatherhood programs
- *Creating Pathways to Adult Education & Employment* — GED prep, career pathway programs, job training, apprenticeships
- *Promoting Financial Resilience & Stability* — financial education programs, children’s savings accounts
